## Appendix A Checklist

Assemble all your documents as listed. Check ( $\square$ ) each applicable item on the checklist and attach the checklist to your documents (a paper clip will do). Send photocopies of all documents, **unless instructed otherwise**. The *Engagement*, if you intend to live in the province of Québec, and the police certificates, must be **originals**. If your documents are not in English or French, send a notarized (certified) translation with a copy of the originals.

1.	IMMIGRATION FORMS Check that they are complete and, where applicable, signed: Application for Permanent Residence This form is completed by you, the principal applicant.	
	<b>Schedule 1</b> You and each of your family members 18 years of age or older must complete their own copy of the form Schedule 1 - Background/Declaration.	
	Additional Family Information You and each of your family members 18 years of age or older must complete their own copy of this form.	
	<b>Use of a Representative</b> If you want us to deal with a representative on your behalf, be sure you have completed and signed the <i>Use of a Representative</i> form (IMM 5476).	
2.	IDENTITY AND CIVIL STATUS DOCUMENTS Birth, marriage, annulment, final divorce or separation certificates for yourself and spouse or common-law partner; death certificate for former spouse if applicable. Photocopy of <i>Citizenship</i> <i>Certificate</i> or <i>Immigrant Visa</i> for any dependents who are Canadian citizens or permanent residents of Canada. For yourself, submit a full two-sided version of your birth certificate. If your spouse or common-law partner is included in your application, submit his/her full two-sided birth certificate. If you are married, submit a full two-sided version of your civil marriage certificate. A Polish church wedding certificate will <b>not</b> be accepted as proof of marriage. If you are divorced, or have been divorced, submit your final divorce decree/Decree Absolute. If your spouse or common-law partner was previously divorced, submit his/her final divorce decree/ Decree Absolute. If you are widowed, submit the death certificate of your spouse.	
3.	CHILDREN'S INFORMATION For each child/dependent included in your application, submit a full two-sided birth certificate which name their parents; adoption papers which name the adoptive parents as "parents" for adopted dependent children; proof of custody for children under the age of 18 and proof that the children may be removed from the jurisdiction of the court; if the children will not accompany you to Canada, proof that you have fulfilled any obligation stated in custody agreements. Proof of continuous full-time studies of all dependent children aged 22 or over: complete school records/transcripts, school index, school ID card, and all diplomas/certificates since attaining age 22, letters from the school(s) indicating the number of hours of classes attended per day, and the number of days attended per week, and proof of full financial support by parents since reaching age 22.	
4.	<b>TRAVEL DOCUMENTS AND PASSPORTS</b> Passports or travel documents for you, your spouse or common-law partner and dependent children. Only include copies of pages showing the passport number, date of issue and expiry, your photo, name, date and place of birth. If you reside in a country different from your nationality include a copy of your visa for the country where you currently reside. All prospective immigrants must hold a valid regular passport; diplomatic, official, service or public affairs passports are <b>not</b> valid for immigration to Canada.	

	If you, or any person included in your application, do not yet have a passport, you must apply for and obtain a valid passport <b>before</b> submitting your application for permanent residence in Canada. Your original passport, and the original passports of your accompanying family members (if applicable), must be presented at the time of visa collection.	
5.	<b>PROOF OF RELATIONSHIP IN CANADA</b> Proof of relationship to your sponsor in Canada, such as the sponsor's full two-sided birth certificate, marriage certificate or adoption certificates and proof of that person's status in Canada: photocopy of the <i>Record of Landing</i> (IMM 1000) of your sponsor or proof of Canadian citizenship such as photocopy of pages of a Canadian passport or Canadian Citizenship card.	
6.	POLICE CERTIFICATES AND CLEARANCES Police certificates or clearances from each country in which you and everyone in your family aged 18 years or over have resided six months or more since reaching 18 years of age. You must attach the original police document(s). Please consult our Web site at: www.cic.gc.ca/english/ information/security/police-cert/index.asp for specific and up-to-date information on how to obtain police certificates from any country.	
7.	ENGAGEMENT Original of the <i>Engagement</i> if your intention is to reside in the province of Québec.	
8.	<b>PHOTO REQUIREMENTS</b> Supply four (4) recent photos for each member of your family and yourself. Follow the instructions in your guide (see <b>Photos</b> in section on completing the Application for Permanent Residence in Canada) and in Appendix B: <b>Photo Specifications</b> .

### Service Standards

If you do not hear from us within six weeks of first submitting your application and documents, you may wish to contact us about the status of your application. Processing times can vary considerably depending on the following main factors: your rapidity in providing us with the information or documents requested, the need to undergo additional medical examinations, various internal verification procedures, postal delays and finally, the number of applications we have to process.

We advise you against trying to contact us by telephone as our files are confidential and their content cannot be discussed over the phone.

## Appendix B Photo Specifications

#### Notes to the applicant

#### TAKE THIS WITH YOU TO THE PHOTOGRAPHER

- Immigration photos are **not** the same as passport photos.
- Make sure that you provide the correct number of photos specified in this guide.


#### Notes to the photographer

#### The photos must:

- show a full front view of the person's head and shoulders showing full face centered in the middle of the photograph;
- have a plain white background;
- be identical (black and white or colour) produced from the same untouched negative, or exposed simultaneously by a split-image or multi-lens camera.

#### The photos must:

- measure between 25 mm and 30 mm (1" and 1 1/5") from chin to crown;
- have a 35 mm x 45 mm (1 3/8" x 1 3/4") finished size.



## Appendix C Medical Instructions

All persons included in your application, whether accompanying you or not, will be required to undergo a medical examination with a physician on the list of designated doctors. If you are a divorced or separated parent, a minor child of whom you have joint or sole custody is considered your dependent child, even if he or she usually lives with the other parent and is not accompanying you to Canada.

The Canadian Embassy in Warsaw **does not** require that you complete an immigration medical examination before submitting your application for permanent residence. After your fully completed application form and your supporting documents are received, we will determine whether you will be required to attend a personal interview. If an interview is deemed necessary, medical instructions will be held on file until the outcome of the interview is known. If an interview is not required, medical instructions will be mailed to you and, if applicable, your family members.

After you receive the necessary medical forms, you and your family members must undergo the necessary medical examinations with one of the doctors on the list of designated doctors, **unless** you and/or your family members live in a country not included on this list. If you wish to have your medical examinations in a country not included on this list, please inform us and we will ensure that you receive the appropriate list.

You will be responsible for the costs of the medical examination for all your family members.

Please note that, at the time of medical examination, you and all family members will be required to present individual passports as evidence of identity. If each of your family members does not already have an individual passport, you should apply to obtain them now.

The permanent residence visa has the same validity period as the medical results, that is, 12 months from the date of the first examination or test.
